Conflict Mineral Statement

Dear Valued Customer:

Texwipe, an ITW Company, hereby certifies, to the best of Texwipe's knowledge and research of our raw materials and processes, the following:

- No conflict metals are used in manufacturing Texwipe's products either as a starting material or as a processing aid; therefore, they are not necessary to the production of Texwipe's products.
- Texwipe has a policy in place addressing conflict mineral sourcing. The policy is available on the ITW website. The link is <http://www.itw.com/wp-content/uploads/2013/07/ITW-Conflict-Minerals-Policy.pdf>. This policy is signed by the President and CEO of ITW.
- Texwipe requires that our direct suppliers be DRC (Democratic Republic of the Congo) conflict-free through our standard contract language.
- If Texwipe were to source materials from a direct supplier that could use listed conflict minerals, we would require the named smelters be validated to have a non-conflict mineral ore-free process by an independent, private sector audit firm.
- Texwipe has implemented due diligence measures for conflict-free sourcing that is in conformance with the IPC-1755 Conflict Minerals Data Exchange standard.
- The supplier due diligence data collected is reviewed against Texwipe's expectations and includes corrective action management, as needed.
- Texwipe is subject to the SEC Conflict Minerals Rule.
